Limited to 24 people - Cost: \$40 per person



PRESIDENT'S LETTER

On behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Normandy Park Community Club, I wish you and your families all the best for a prosperous 2019! 2018 was a busy year for your community club, with continued improvements to the grounds and refurbishment of elements of the Cove building.

As your club president, I cannot emphasize strongly enough the continued importance and support of our members and volunteers in keeping the Cove the great benefit it is to all of us. As you read the club newsletters and listen to the Annual Meeting presentations, you will notice the same names again and again. Without volunteers joining us at the monthly Stewards of The Cove, supporting various social events, and helping when those special projects pop up during the year, the Cove would be much less of a joy than it is now. You don't have to be a Board member to be on a NPCC committee or to help with events. Anyone who wants to volunteer can talk to a Board member or contact the Cove office. Staci can always help in identifying volunteer opportunities.

As we enter 2019, the Board will lose a number of long time trustees. **Dano Lorella, Joe Peritore, and Bob Cowan** (who served as Board President for 5 years) will leave the Board – but all are committed to staying active as volunteers! At the same time we welcome new Board members **Tayna Lorella, Mark Lewinger, and Derick Pierce**, and welcome back long time volunteer **Tony Cassarino** for another term. As always, we thank these Board members as well as all our volunteers who contributed their time, energy and ideas in making the Cove experience better.

2018 saw continued improvements to NPCC facilities and grounds. In the Cove building, the main room lighting was upgraded to LED, and a new coffee pot and ice machine were purchased and installed. As with our homes, the Cove building requires ongoing attention and maintenance activities, many of which are required but not visible, such as annual floor refinishing and cleaning and oiling the deck. Behind the building, a new shed was donated and built to store a donated lawn mower which will enable us to better maintain the lawn area.

On the grounds, the usual year-round work to maintain the boat ramp, grounds, beach areas, boardwalks, bridges, trails, tennis courts, and parking areas kept the grounds in great shape. Several major efforts in 2018 included an aggressive forest management program, including removing 30 dead or dying trees. The footings and abutments of the bridge by the duck pond were the subject of a major repair project to level/stabilize the bridge which had taken on a noticeable tilt. Finally, the baseball backstop received a long overdue clean up and paint job!

The social activities plan for 2019 will continue many favorite events. For adults, the **Sweetheart Dance** will be back in February, with dance lessons available for those needing refreshers on their steps. In March, the **Western Barn Dance** will be back, and in May it's **Cinco de Mayo**. New activities in 2018 included cooking classes, with more to follow in 2109. Potential additional activities may also be identified as a result of a membership survey we are asking all our members to fill out and return.

For the kids, we will again have the **Easter Egg Hunt**, and the December **Santa Party**, including a special visit from Santa Claus and activities sponsored by the **Normandy Park Arts Commission**.

For the whole family, there is the annual **4th of July Parade and Community Celebration** co-sponsored by the City and NPCC. This event brings the whole community of Normandy Park together for the parade and fun run starting at Marvista Elementary School and ending at the Cove for food, fun, and classic cars to celebrate America's birthday with friends and neighbors.

The NPCC will again host the annual **Rummage Sale** in June, the **Artist United Show** in November, and the traditional **Holiday Bazaar** in December. All of these events are the opportunity to meet your neighbors and see the great talents your friends and neighbors bring to the community.

Thank you for your continued support, both financially and with your hard work for the NPCC and all that is going on here. We welcome you to join us at Stewards of the Cove each month, participate on a committee or just come down and enjoy this beautiful place with beach walks, camp fires, or picnics with family and friends. We look forward to your participation with us as we strive to make the NPCC a better place for all of us and the community.

2019 Stewardship Schedule

March 9 9 am – 12 pm	Invasive weed control: blackberries, reed canary grass, ivy; plant native plants and trees
April 13 9 am – 12 pm	Annual Cove Spring Cleanup: remove winter debris from beach and grounds, repair paths, maintain gardens, pull ivy
May 11 9 am – 12 pm	Maintain gardens; plant inspection and maintenance; open boat ramp; dredge silt ponds; move logs
June 8 9 am – 12 pm	Invasive weed control: policeman's helmet, nightshade, ivy; plant annuals; maintain gardens
July 13 9 am – 12 pm	Plant inspection and maintenance; maintain gardens; start in-stream habitat improvements
August 10 9 am – 12pm	Invasive weed control in wetlands; maintain gardens
September 14 9 am – 12 pm	Complete in-stream habitat improvements; maintain gardens; invasive weed control
October 12 9 am – 12 pm	Plant and mulch native trees and plants; start salmon counting October through December
