

Our rentals are up to pre-Covid numbers, and like the salmon, people are returning. This year we hope to increase our social events so we can all meet and interact.

I would like to begin by thanking the retiring members of the Board of Trustees. **Eileen Hess, Diane Numrich, and Patty Spangler** have all spent six long years representing and supporting our membership. These were not the easiest of times for our Community Club, but they, like the other Board members, rose to the challenge. Thank you.

# STEWARDS OF THE COVE 2022 RECAP

October closed out another very successful year with the Stewards of the Cove. In 2022, over 110 volunteers donated over 650 hours to pruning, weeding, spreading mulch, rock, and earth, then doing it all over the next month. Someone said that we could hire two full time gardeners to do the work that this amazing set of volunteers do on a monthly basis!

Led by the expertise of Merry Ann Peterson, Eric Mosher, and Tony Cassarino, the Stewards continue to set the bar on just how nice our Cove can look. Some of the work that was accomplished this year includes: revamping the west entry garden, removing invasive weeds near the streams, pruning the roses and salmonberries, planting new trees in the forest, clearing the boat ramp and trails to the beach, adding flowers around the beach porta potty and spreading yards of bark, chippings, soil, and gravel. There is no job too big or too small for this hardy bunch.

Volunteers were also treated to gastronomical delights like Bill's Burgers and Georgia's Sandwiches as a reward for their hard work. Stewards run every year from March through October on the second Saturday of the month. If you are interested, no experience is need, but a good set of gloves helps.
