
DANCE LESSONS

STEWARDSHIP SATURDAY 2023 RECAP

October closed out a very successful 2023 for the Stewards of the Cove. More than 100 volunteers donated over 700 hours to pruning, weeding, spreading mulch, rock, and earth, then doing it all over the next month. Someone said that we could hire two full time gardeners to do the work that this amazing set of volunteers does monthly!

The Stewards continue to set the standard for just how nice our Cove can look. Some of the work that was accomplished this year included: maintaining the many gardens, removing invasive weeds near the streams, pruning the roses and salmonberries, planting new trees in the forest and on the grounds, clearing the boardwalk and trails to the beach, adding flowers and plants throughout the grounds, and spreading yards of bark, chippings, soil, and gravel. There is no job too big or too small for this hardy bunch.

Volunteers started their Saturday mornings at 9:00 with coffee - donated by Starbucks - and pastries. As a reward for their labors, Stewards were treated to lunches ranging from chili to gourmet sandwiches. And of course, there was always a variety of yummy desserts thanks to the Pickle Sisters.
